## Front of the Room

In the front of the room, we included things we wanted the students to be reminded of throughout the day. One of these things included their behavior chart. This was in the front of the room so that students would easily be able to check where they were at for behavior during the day and whether they were on track or if they needed to maybe work harder. The students were often responsible for moving their own clothespin after having a behavior addressed, whether good or bad, so that they understood the importance of what they had done.


Next to our behavior clip chart, was our bulletin board with the pockets that held the students' tickets they earned for positive behavior. Having this up front and near the door, served as a reminder to them of what they could earn. All of them were very proud of their tickets and strived to get as many as possible.


This was my first bulletin board I ever did. The students made the faces for their own Jack-O-Lanterns and behind them are the students' pockets in which they keep their positive behavior tickets

In the front of the room was also the daily schedule so that students would be able to check up on what we were going to be doing during the day. This helped them prepare and helped prevent many questions about what was going to be happening next. Right next to this was a reminder to put names on papers, our classroom timer, and how they should choose what book to read (I PICK).


This board at the front of the room is also connected to behavioral management. This board includes the expectations for voice levels for various places throughout the school. Students are thus able to use this to check how they are doing by asking themselves if they are too loud for where they are at or where they are going. The students are also able to check here when we have to ask them or remind them to check their voice levels.
